SAT TEST

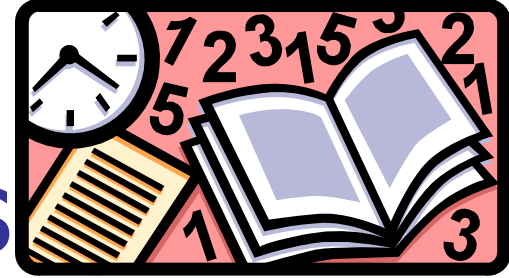
- Reading and writing
- Math
- Optional essay
- Scores: 200-800 each section
- No penalty for guessing!

ACT TEST

- 25% English, math, reading, and science reasoning
- Optional essay
- Scores: 1-36
- No penalty for guessing!
- www.act.org



SAT Subject Tests



- Subject Area Tests: Math, Chemistry, Biology, World History, Physics, etc
- Required by CERTAIN colleges and universities
- Offered on the SAME DAY as the SAT
- You may register to take up to (3) SAT Subject Tests on the same date

NCAA Clearing House Form

- Athletes applying to a Division I or II schools **MUST** fill out an NCAA Clearing House Form





Applying for Admission

- Application
- Transcript
- Letters of recommendation
- Essay
- Resume
- Application fee
- Interview



Application Deadlines



- **Early Decision:** binding (deadline October or November)
- **Early Action:** not binding (deadline early November)
- **Regular Decision:** varies per college/ university (contact each institution to find out deadlines)



Financial Aid/Scholarships

- **Grants:** Free Money
- **Loans:** must be repaid with interest
- **Work study:** tax-free work at college or university and get paid
- **Scholarships:** search for local and institutional scholarships.
